

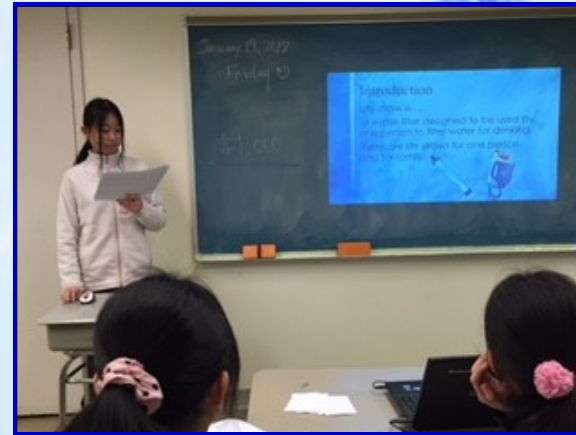
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It is a thirsty world! 7A has learned that controlling water is important and some parts of the world lack access to clean water.

Students also expressed their opinions about priorities using phrases like 'The most important thing / My highest priority/The main thing/ A priority.'

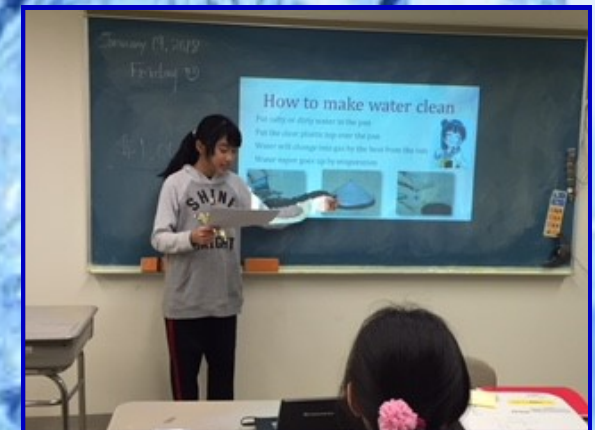


Presentation of Life Straw
