3rd Grade

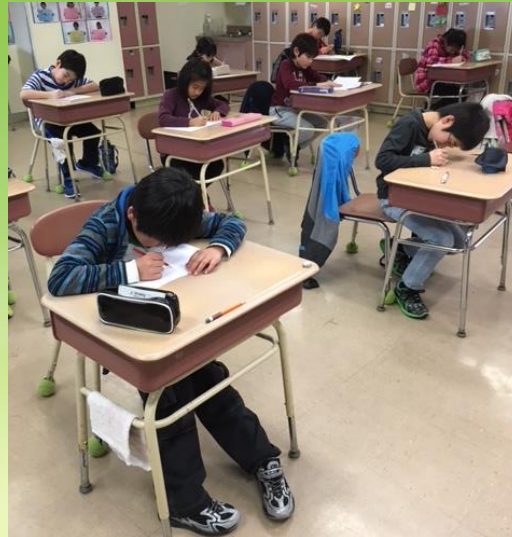
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Once a year, we give an English placement test for GJS students. The test is given to all the 1st grade through the 8th grade students. By the outcome of the test, each student is assigned to the proper level of English class. A class is the highest and C class is the lowest level.

The test for the 1st and 2nd tests are called LAB (Language Assessment Battery) test, and 3rd through 8th grades are called LAS Links (Language Assessment System) test. The both tests combine four segments of the English language: reading, writing, speaking and listening. Reading, writing and speaking tests are conducted in a classroom as a whole group. However, speaking test is done differently; an English teacher who is not a student's own teacher conducts a test.

3A students did their best for the test. Besides working on a text book, they borrowed a number of books from GJS Library. After reading them, they wrote book reports. They also practiced listening and speaking using a CD program. They were certainly relieved when the test was over!
